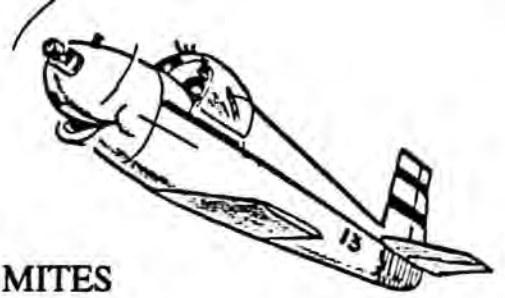

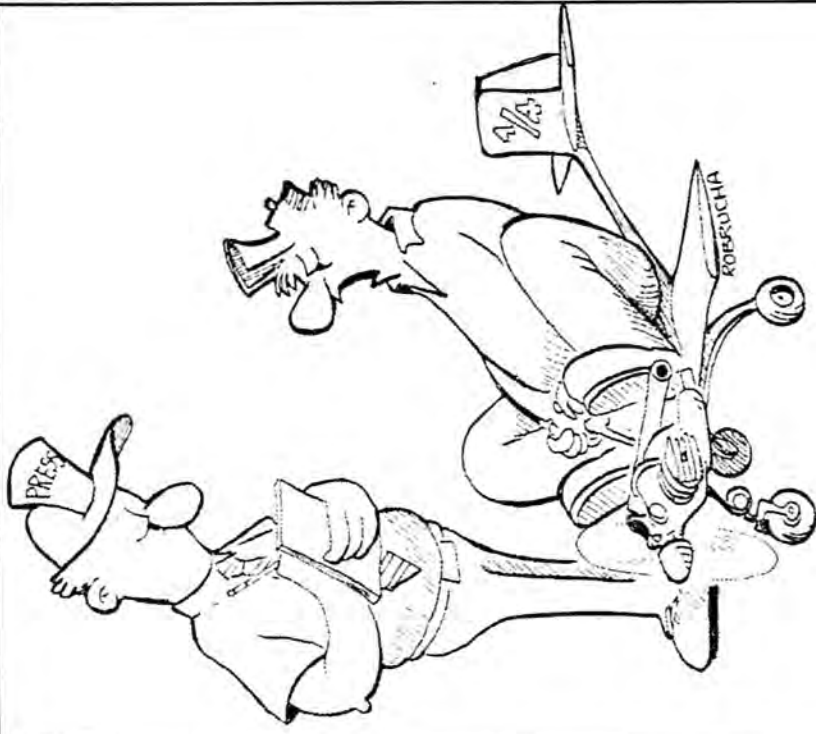

Mal Gross sent me an internet copy of the Bryce Boylan mite accident of 9 July 1996. The problems related by NTSB reports add up to either carb heat or a fuel transfer problem. Bryce was seriously injured but survived the incident in the mite that day. He was flying in VFR conditions at 2000 ft when the engine problems caused lost power, so the pilot attempted a landing on a road, his only option! The message here is to monitor carb icing potential during flight at all times. It happened to me on a warm day when one is not thinking of carb icing. Be alert!!! Fly safely!!!

Another great year draws to a close to reflect upon our past of the great times we had together. These years go by rather rapidly, I'm afraid. However, so the world turns and tempis fugit (time flies)....another holiday season is upon us; whereby Wamm extends a warm healthy holiday greeting to all and may Santa Claus bring you great goodies for you and your mooney mite!
